Dr. Abdulaziz Al-Yahya: A Pioneer in Pharmacology and Toxicology

In the rapidly evolving fields of health and science, Dr. Abdulaziz Al-Yahya is a distinguished figure in pharmacy and pharmacology. He is the Vice Dean of the Doctor of Pharmacy and Nursing Programs at ISNC, where he drives advancements in education and research. As part of the college's founding team, he also leads its Quality Assurance Committee.

Dr. Al-Yahya earned his Bachelor's degree in Pharmaceutical Sciences from King Saud University, showcasing academic excellence and a strong passion for pharmacology. He later pursued his Master's and Ph.D. in Pharmacology and Toxicology from the University of Kansas, focusing on the central nervous system and neurotransmitters.

Previously, he directed the Research Center at King Saud University's College of Pharmacy and chaired its Health Colleges Research Support Committee.



Dr. Abdulaziz Al-Yahya is a member of the Society for Neuroscience, the Saudi Pharmaceutical Society, and ICORD at the University of British Columbia, collaborating with researchers to drive innovation.

He is dedicated to improving academic programs, building international partnerships, and training new pharmacists in scientific research, strengthening his impact on education, research, and innovation.



ISNC Opens Advanced Simulation Pharmacy: Hands-On Training to Enhance Students Skills





ISNC continues to play a pivotal role in advancing healthcare in Saudi Arabia. The Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) Program has launched a state-of-the-art Simulation Pharmacy, operational since the start of the academic year 1446 H (2024-2025). This facility is designed to enhance pharmaceutical education and training, consisting of several specialized sections:

- Medication Dispensing Section: functions as an outpatient pharmacy with a dedicated data entry area.
- Unit Dose Pharmacy Section: simulates an inpatient pharmacy setting.
- Intravenous Preparation Section: equipped with advanced technology to operate as an IV medication pharmacy, adhering to the highest safety standards.

The Simulation Pharmacy is a significant step toward fostering professional competencies among Pharm.D. students. It provides early practical training in a controlled environment replicating real-world pharmacy operations. This initiative develops essential skills in pharmaceutical care, medication management, sterile IV preparation, and communication through patient counseling and education.

By linking theoretical knowledge with hands-on experience, ISNC and its Pharm.D. Program are committed to preparing students for excellence in the clinical field of pharmacy.



Training in Biomedical Research for High School Students

Basic Training in Biomedical Research and Innovation: ISNC organized a course titled "Basic Training in Biomedical Research and Innovation." The program ran from November 10 to 14, 2024, at the Research and Innovation Center of ISNC.

The course aimed to introduce high school students to key concepts and techniques in biomedical research, fostering interest and providing hands-on laboratory experience. A total of 31 students from public and private schools in Jeddah and Makkah participated in the training.

Feedback from trainers and facilitators during and after the sessions indicated that the training objectives were successfully achieved. The program combined theoretical sessions, including presentations and discussions, with practical laboratory experiments and sample examinations.

The workshop focused on essential first aid skills for handling emergency situations involving children. The main objectives included teaching participants CPR for children, rescuing drowning children, managing choking incidents, and treating burns.

By the end of the session, the students showcased excellent practical skills in applying CPR, rescuing children from drowning and choking, and handling burn cases. This success highlights the workshop's effectiveness in equipping the students with crucial first aid skills for children.




ISNC: Opening of a New Cafeteria in the Female Students' Section
